- Who used to be an original iniciators of research projects?
- How used to be ensured cooperation with VI - respondents?
- What is the role of VIP-nongovernmental organisation to ensure contact with VI-respondents?
- What types of survey methods used to be applied?

„Soft“ data sources – cont.

Task 2.2 for working groups

Try to analyse your national experience by answering on following question:

- How are utilised data/information received within research project concerning VIP?

3. Joint report preparation

Task 3 for working groups:

- Is it relevant to expect comparable international data/statistics concerning VIP?
- What would be a purpose of mentioned international cooperation?
- How to ensure comparability of data/statistics being prepared in national context (common indicators? Open method of coordination?)
